He is delighted to be back at The Hexagon, which is his favourite concert hall in the Central Reading area!

Patrick Bailey *Conductor*

Patrick Bailey is a conductor, composer and presenter who has worked with lots of the UK's best orchestras including the finest of them all, the RPO! He has conducted all sorts of music in all sorts of places, including operas in sports halls, musicals in farm sheds, orchestras in car parks and bagpipes in Norfolk. He has worked with Tim Steiner on several occasions and survived!

Des Oliver *Composer Spotlight*

Des Oliver is a composer, author and documentary filmmaker. He has written music for orchestras, chamber groups and choirs, as well as operas and theatre music. Most recently, he composed a song for the Pegasus Opera Company's community choir to celebrate Windrush Day, as well as a song for The Bach Choir, which is to be included on their next album released later this year.
